

#### SUMMARY

In the context of these exceptional times, the protection of natural systems and resources, the resiliency of human-made environments and access to nature stand out even more poignantly than before as key issues for the future of our planet and societies.

The webinar Access to Nature addressed the notions of green systems (natural and anthropic) and green infrastructure as fundamental themes and endeavors of our professional fields. In other words, we need to think boldly about the encounter between natural systems and urban planning, between nature and culture. Both large-scale development and small-scale interventions must be handled in a more radical, cross-disciplinary approach, breaking down the silos of planning and governance, and zoning for that matter. These institutional barriers hinder the creation of more resilient ways of city building and the huge social and economic benefits that come from healthier natural environments at all scales of the city.

Whereas science-based approaches should guide decision making (soil and species selection, water and canopy management) in Canada, there is much to learn from indigenous worldviews regarding our relationship, interconnectivity and responsibility to the natural world. Sensitivity and openness to other forms of knowledge also remind us of our planning and design fields' responsibility to ensure all voices in the design of open spaces and the need to create design environments that guarantee citizen engagement. A more inclusive and equitable access to natural systems in an urban environment can also mean a time-sharing management approach to accessibility to safeguard the resiliency of all forms of life.
